Contributors

Robert A. Bernstein (Ph.D., Cornell University, 1970) is Associate Professor of Political Science at Auburn University. He has published books in the areas of congressional politics and methodology, and his articles have appeared in numerous journals, including the *American Political Science Review*, the *American Politics Quarterly*, the *Legislative Studies Quarterly*, and the *Western Political Quarterly*.

Charles S. Bullock, III (Ph.D., Washington University, 1968) is the Richard B. Russell Professor of Political Science at the University of Georgia, and has served as president of the Southern Political Science Association.
