Beverley J. Anderson (Ph.D., Boston College, 1985) is Associate Professor of Sociology at Eastern Connecticut University. Her research interests include gender politics and Caribbean studies. She has published in the *Arena Review*, and has a chapter in *Columbian Quincentenary*.

Clyde Brown (Ph.D., University of Iowa, 1986) is Associate Professor of Political Science at Miami University. He has published previously on the subject of interest group membership, in outlets such as the *American Politics Quarterly*.
