*Charles S. Bullock, III* (Ph.D., Washington University, 1968) is the Richard B. Russell Professor of Political Science at the University of Georgia, and has served as president of the Southern Political Science Association. He has authored several books in the areas of civil rights and public policy, and has published articles in several journals, including the *American Political Science Review*, the *Journal of Politics*, and the *American Journal of Political Science*.

*Donald L. Davison* (Ph.D., Washington University, 1986) is Assistant Professor of Politics at Rollins College. His research interests include the effects of race on political behavior, civil rights policy, and congressional politics.
