any alumni of the University who attended the Canterbury Association while they were at the University, whether Episcopal or not, would see this letter and write to us.

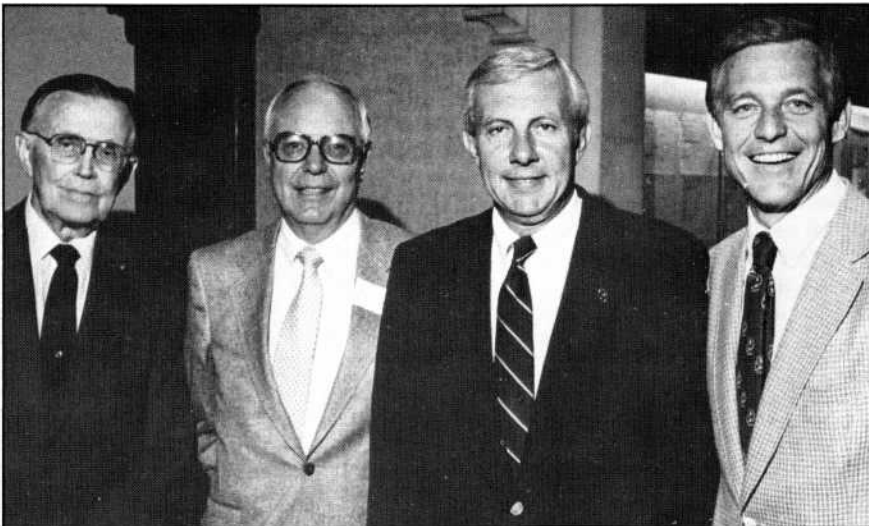
