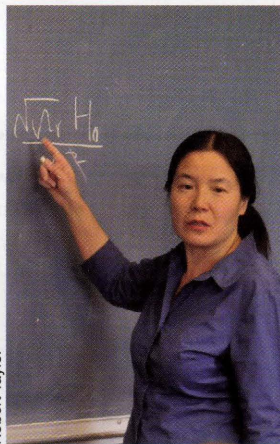
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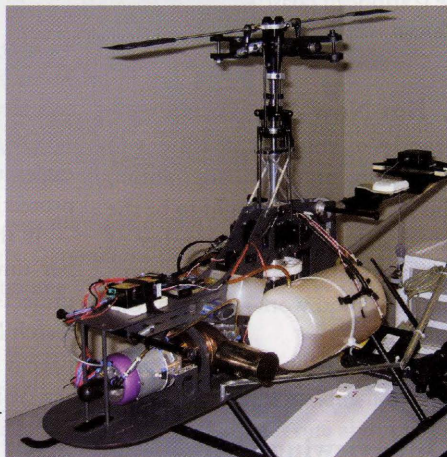
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Four glorious, sold-out performances in April transformed a grand experiment into a smashing success for the huge cast of fine arts students from every area of the college.
