## Spring cover story on Zika triggers memories

It may be of interest to know that a Sooner was actively involved in viral epidemiology a long time ago.

I arrived at OU in 1963 with the desire to learn everything

I could about viruses. Fortunately, the Department of Botany-Microbiology had hired Dr. Donald C. Cox to undertake a program in virology. After completing my M.S. in virology in 1969, I began my military service in the United States Air Force. Through a number of amazing encounters, I eventually became assistant chief of virology in the USAF Epidemiology Division, School of Aero-



space Medicine. In that capacity I investigated numerous disease outbreaks, including Venezuelan Equine Encephalitis in south Texas, rubella virus in neonates, and individual and mass rabies virus exposures. We demonstrated how influenza virus entered and spread within continental United States in 1972, and investigated numerous Acute Respiratory Disease outbreaks, including a high mortality adenovirus pneumonia epidemic at Lackland AFB.

When I left the Air Force in 1973, I applied my experience to start a clinical virology laboratory at the University of California, Davis, Medical Center in Sacramento. I continued as the clinical virologist/microbiologist in various facilities until my retirement in 2015. My fascination with viruses and viral pathogenesis will remain with me all my days. I will always be grateful to Professor Cox and the University of Oklahoma for the impetus to start a fascinating career.
