

As I recall, there were 40 tourists that year and we visited 10 cities in seven countries. Unfortu-

An airline representative and I served whatever food, drink and cigarettes we could find. There were no regular meals. The Sooner folks were good sports and adjusted well to the inconveniences. As others have found, the passengers always seemed to watch over others and try to cooperate in everyone's interest. On the way back, however, the pilots of the same airline went on strike. During our three days in Madrid, the guests were able to take all of their tours but it took all of that time to find another airline to take us home. All in all, it was a great experience and some wonderful people took the trip and we were only a little late getting home. Although there are always some problems in all travel, it sounds like more recent trips have gone well and I hope the effort continues to prosper.
