

## **Grounds for Celebration**

ALLEN KING has helped make OU a beautiful place for more than three decades. Now, the retiring director of landscaping and grounds and keeper of OU's iconic autumn mum display has been recognized with the 2018 Otis Sullivant Award. The \$20,000 annual prize is given to a faculty or staff member who exhibits "keen perceptivity" and is named to honor a longtime Oklahoma political journalist who was known for his ability to analyze and predict political trends.

A record \$322.4 million in gifts during fiscal year 2016 led *The Chronicle of Higher Education* to place OU givers above such schools as Princeton, Brown, the University of Virginia and Texas A&M. "This tremendous ranking is a testament to our generous donors who invest so deeply in the mission of our university," says President David L. Boren.
