

#### **Drama welcomes new director**

"We are delighted to announce the appointment of Seth Gordon as director of the Helmerich School of Drama at OU," says Mary Margaret Holt, dean of the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts. Gordon has a distinguished background in professional theatre that includes the Repertory Theatre of St. Louis, Stages Repertory in Houston, the Cleveland Playhouse, and the positions of founder and director of Primary Stages' New American Writers Group in New York. Holt says Gordon brings "a wealth of theatrical experience to share with the school, college and university."

### **Video-assisted surgery**

**OU Medicine's Stephenson Cancer Center** is now offering a minimally invasive lung cancer surgery called VATS – Video-Assisted Thoracoscopic Surgery. J. Matthew Reinersman, M.D., a thoracic surgeon, and his colleague Subrato J. Deb, M.D., are the only two surgeons in Oklahoma who specialize in the procedure. During VATS, three small incisions are made in the patient's side to insert a tiny camera and surgical instruments. The camera transmits images of the lungs onto a video screen to guide the surgery. "We can get patients out of the hospital as soon as one to three days after the procedure," says Reinersman.
