OU's Nichols, Hurts named Big 12 Athletes of the Year

University of Oklahoma gymnast Maggie Nichols and former quarterback Jalen Hurts have been named the 2019-20 Big 12 Athletes of the Year. Nichols is the only Sooner to win the award two years in a row and also to win the AAI Award, the gymnastic "Heisman." She intends to return to OU in the fall to finish her master's degree in sports broadcasting, while Hurts has signed with the Philadelphia Eagles.



Record Research

The University of Oklahoma announced a record-high \$255.6 million in research awards earned through grants and external funding by OU researchers on the Norman campus. The fiscal year 2020 total surpasses the previous benchmark of \$218 million for the 2019 fiscal year. Adds Tomás Díaz de la Rubia, OU Vice President for Research and Partnerships, "The continued growth of sponsored research at OU is testament to the creativity, innovation and hard work of our faculty and to the quality of the research being explored."

OU plans educational events on Tulsa Race Massacre

OU will commemorate the 100-year anniversary of the Tulsa Race Massacre with a yearlong educational initiative across the university's three campuses. Scholars around the nation are gaining new insight into the event that took place in the Greenwood District of Tulsa in 1921, when a white mob of several thousand attacked the prosperous black neighborhood, killing hundreds. The project is being coordinated by professors Kalenda Eaton and Karlos Hill of the Clara Luper Department of African and African American Studies.



MOVING AND SHAKING IN THE LIBRARY

Tim Smith, head of web services and artificial intelligence for the University of Oklahoma Libraries, was recently named to the 2020 Movers & Shakers by *Library Journal*. By utilizing new technology and analyzing data, Smith has helped improve visitor engagement in everything from exhibitions (people like timelines and graphics over text) to creating a homework calculator that gives students a step-by-step timeline of what they need to do to complete an assignment.
