"HOMECOMING"

HOMECOMING this year will center around the twenty-third annual Missouri-Oklahoma football game. During this time Missouri has won eleven and amassed a total of 343 points, while the Sooners have won nine, and garnered 228 points. Two games were tied.

The Tigers are coached by Frank Carideo, Notre Dame All-American quarterback during 1929-30. Though getting off to a bad start against such teams as Northwestern and Texas University—the Missouri eleven has shown steady improvement since the beginning of the season, and is expected to give Oklahoma a real battle.

Carideo will display the wares of the famous Knute Rockne system with its quick shifting backfield, and thrilling offensive type of play. The kick-off is at 2 p. m.

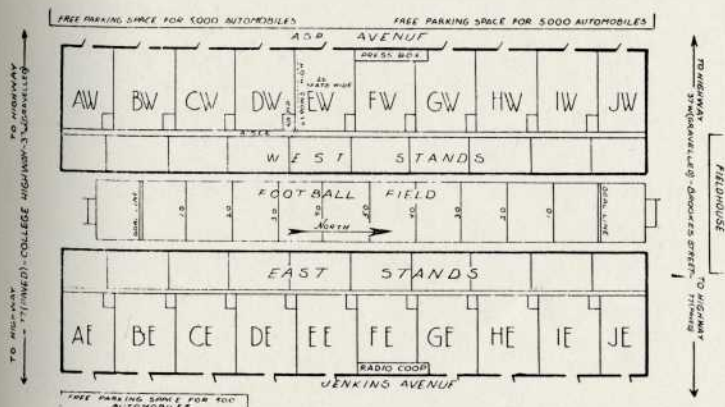

HOW TO ORDER SEATS FOR HOME GAMES



Address all orders for tickets to Ben G. Owen, Athletic Director, Fieldhouse, University of Oklahoma, Norman, Okla., specifying your choice of seats, paying for same by personal check, cashier's check or money order and enclosing 20 cents extra for postage and registration. These instructions apply to the Texas-Oklahoma game at Dallas as well as the four games at Norman with Tulsa university, Kansas State, Missouri and Nebraska. Don't forget to include the federal tax when paying for your seats. Tickets for all home games will go on sale September 15. Thereafter they will be mailed out the same day order for them is received. Persons who buy tickets for more than one game should consult the stadium section diagram and stipulate in his order what section he desires. Thus identical seats for the big home games may be sent at one early mailing. Earliest purchases will naturally get the choice seats and get them for the whole season.
