Keen Men Rejuvenated Since Early Season Match

WHEN the National Champion Oklahoma Aggies come to Norman, March 16, they will meet a Sooner team quite different from the one they defeated 31 to 3 at Stillwater, February 16. Four of the Sooner regulars—Carr, 118-pounder; Sisney, 145; Kalpin, 155; and Bashara, heavyweight—were out of that contest because of deficient grades. Keen has been developing some new men and his cripples have undergone a successful hospitalization.

Second Annual Meet To Be Sponsored

The second annual Oklahoma Amateur Track and Field Meet, to be sponsored by the University, will be held on the outdoor cinder oval April 7.

Out-of-school amateurs will be eligible to compete as well as Intercollegiate athletes, and the feature event probably will be the mile run between Glen Dawson, Soonerland's 1,000-meter champion (National A.A.U. indoor), Horace "Chick" Peden, former Central College runner who is now teaching school near Fletcher and is said to be in A-1 shape, already having run a mile in 4:25 on the road, and Floyd Lochner, Sooner star. Other amateurs who will compete are Howell, Mell, Adkinson, Morris, Hildt, Bryce and Ralph Higgins, Medley, and Strong.

The new schedule of events includes in the races: 100, 880, mile, 60-yard high hurdles, 120-yard low hurdles, 440 relay and mile relay. Field events: shot, discus, javelin, high jump, broad jump, vault, and the hop, step and jump. Also, 440 yards relay for highschools.
