Executive board meeting

The annual meeting of the Executive Board of the University of Oklahoma Association, including retiring members, was held in the card room of the Oklahoma Union June 5. Chester H. Westfall, '16journ, of Ponca City, was re-elected president. Lewis R. Morris, '15as, of Oklahoma City, was elected first vice president and Weaver Holland, '13sc, of Dallas, Texas, second vice president. Frank S. Cleckler, '21bus, of Norman, was re-elected executive secretary-treasurer. Earl Foster, '13law, Oklahoma City, and John Rogers, '14law, Tulsa, were elected to fill the vacancies caused by the resignations of Fletcher Riley and Orel Busby. The Board discussed and approved unanimously a statement directed to the taxpayers of Oklahoma relative to the proposed abolition of the engineering college at the university.

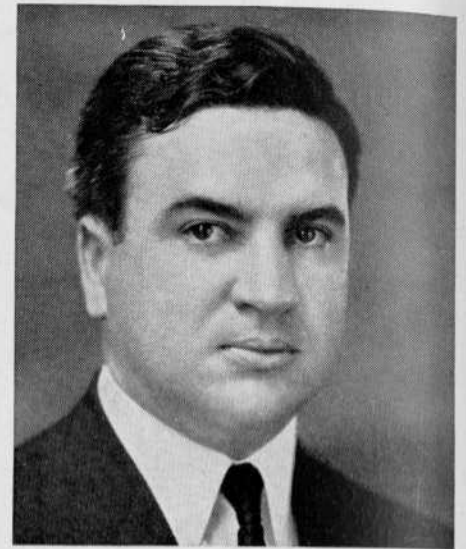
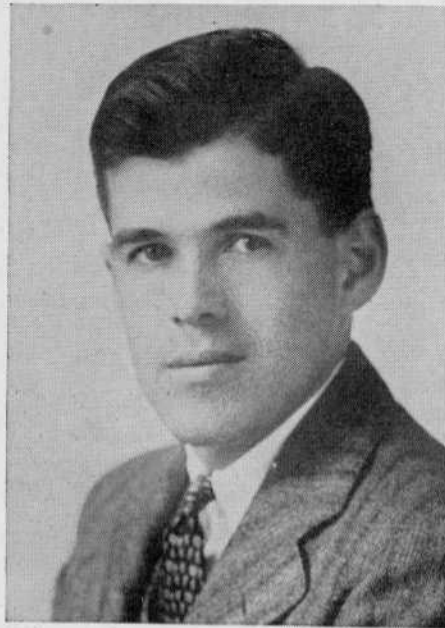
