A Gala Homecoming

JKLAHOMA'S Homecoming celebration was a rip-roaring gala event for two days running and would have wound itself up into a burst of glory had not one inconsiderate alumnus brought a couple of joy-kills down to Norman to harass the Oklahomans for thirty seconds.

That alumnus was Adrian Hobart Lindsey, who took a degree at the University in 1930 while he was Sconer football coach. He came back in the role of Kansas coach and the pair of inconsiderates he brought along were a Mr. George Hapgood and a Mr. Rutherford B. Hayes.

The former threw a forward pass and the latter caught it and Mr. Lindsey won a ball game in the last thirty seconds of play. Many of the Sooner fans and Homecoming celebrators, however, had left the ball park thinking the game would be a scoreless tie and to them Oklahoma remains the better ball club.

This grief lasted only thirty seconds, so the rest of the two days will go down as one of the best Homecomings on the books.

Almer S. "Mike" Monroney,'24as, the Oklahoma City Alumni club president, engineered the best pre-Homecoming dinner-dance ever held. From his position in the middle of the main table, he kept the speeches short, the barbs darting and everyone in high spirits.

The theme of the banquet was "Why is a Lawyer?" and Mr. Monroney opened and closed the dinner event with thrusts at law students who, he said, have dominated the Oklahoma City Alumni club for many years. In the end, however, he turned over the president's dinner-gong to Coleman H. Hayes,'24as,'26law, Oklaho-

ma City attorney, and fortunately closed the dinner before Mr. Hayes turned his law associates loose in the general direction of Mr. Monroney.

Members of the 1915 all-victorious Sooner football team celebrated the twentieth anniversary of their great season. Leon C. "Red" Phillips, '16law, member of the team, Okemah attorney and speaker of the state house of representatives, introduced members of the 1915 Sooner team and delivered a few thrusts at the toastmaster in behalf of his law associates.

President W. B. Bizzell and Captain Lawrence "Biff" Jones were other speakers, and the football lettermen present in the crowd of five hundred were introduced. There were scores of them including Tom Churchill, Ram Morrison, Neil Johnson, Bill Cross, Graham Johnson, Tub Tyler, Howard McCasland and Bus Haskins.

Mrs. Ad Lindsey made one of the surprise addresses of the evening. She humorously recounted the trials and tribulations of being a coach's wife. Also, she told of the difficulties in changing football loyalties. She is a K. U. alumna. When Ad came to Oklahoma, she became a Sooner fan. Now that he is back on Mount Oread, she is a Jayhawk fan.

Most of the five hundred stayed for the dance after the dinner and among the dancers were Josh Lee, Major and Mrs. Kidd, Eugene P. Ledbetter, Malcolm Rosser, Orel Busby, Ted Beaird, Dean A. B. Adams and scores of others.

The parade the following morning in Norman was the best in the history of Homecomings. Forty floats and four bands and four queens took part. The Scabbard

and Blade float was judged the best in the procession and the Alpha Tau Omega house was given first prize for the best decorations.

Members of the alumni association executive board met after the parade and stayed in session until shortly before game time.

At the game were a number of celebrities including Governor E. W. Marland who made an address over the loud speaking system between halves; Emil Ludwig, the noted German historian and biographer; One-Eyed Conneley, the world's greatest gate crasher; and scores of others.

The reception in the Union ballroom attracted several hundred persons after the football game. The Norman Alumni club was host and Alvan Muldrow, president, directed events.
