In the top row, left to right, Dr. Duane Roller, '23as, '25M.S., professor of physics, is conducting a survey on the methods of teaching, selection of material and various aspects of physical sciences for the Rockefeller Foundation; Dr. Joseph Marshburn, professor of English, is on a year's leave of absence to do research work in the Folger Library in Washington, D.C.; and Dr. Gustav Mueller, assistant professor of philosophy, is author of the book "Philosophy of Our Uncertainties" released by the University of Oklahoma Press and recommended by the Book-of-the-Month club.
