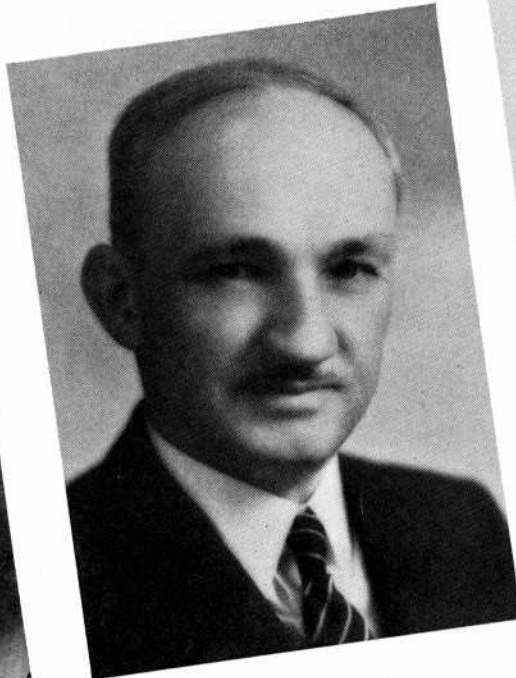


Sooner leaders in national fraternities

David R. Milsten, '25, '28law, Tulsa attorney, is supreme vice-president of Sigma Alpha Mu social fraternity.

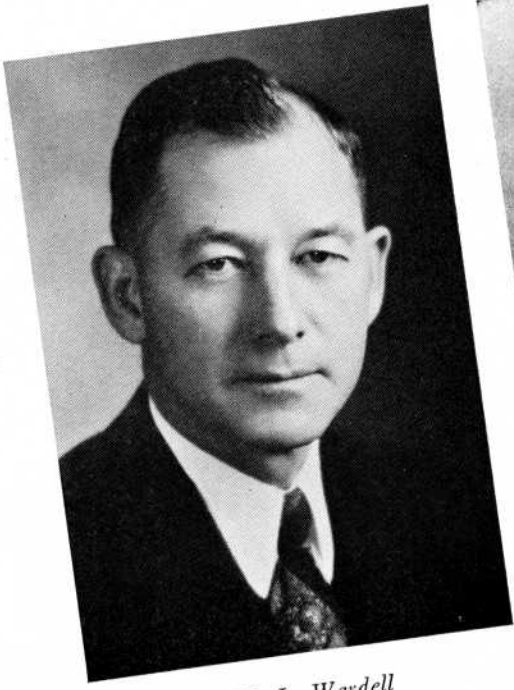
Errett R. Newby, '07, '08, Oklahoma City business man, is first vice-regent of Sigma Nu fraternity.
