



# A New School Year at the University of Oklahoma

## Outlook for the New Year

"The University will enter upon its forty-seventh annual session in September. The institution is rapidly approaching its Semicentennial and the enrolment this Fall will take us well on the way toward the 10,000 mark that we expect when we open the fiftieth session three years from now. The University has enrolled 9,086 students since last September. I confidently expect the student population for 1938-39 to approximate 7,000 students. Year after year an increasing number of students come to the University and unless all signs fail, the number of students who will enter the University this Fall will far exceed that of the past academic year."—*William Bennett Bizzell, president.*

## The Freshman Period

All freshmen entering the University of Oklahoma this Fall are required to attend a meeting in the University Auditorium, Holmberg Hall, at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, September 14. Parents of freshmen are invited to meet at 2 p.m. in Room 105 of the same building, to be taken on a tour of the campus by senior honor students.

Conferences and placement examinations for freshmen will continue Wednesday evening and Thursday. On Friday, freshmen will meet with representatives of colleges,

schools and departments to have courses of study approved, and on Saturday, they will complete enrolment.

## Upperclass Enrolment

Registration of upperclassmen will take place Friday, September 16, and classwork will begin Monday morning, September 19.

## Fees

The following fees are collected regularly from students at the time of enrolment:

Incidental and service fee, each semester	\$10.00
R.O.T.C., first semester	12.00
W.S.G.A., each semester	.50
Physical Education, each semester	2.50
Laboratory fees and deposits:	
Arts and Sciences (Average)	4.00
Premedic, each semester	12.00
Business or Education, each semester	3.00
Engineering, each semester (Average)	14.00
Pharmacy, each semester	22.00 to 30.00

A late enrolment fee of \$2 is charged; for each additional day after classwork be-

gins, \$1 is added to the initial late enrolment fee of \$2 until the maximum of \$5 is reached. The clerical fee for "change of studies" card is .50; for re-enrolment after withdrawal, \$2.

By action of the Board of Regents a non-resident fee is collected from out-of-state students at the time of enrolment as follows: each semester \$50. This fee is in addition to those listed above.

## Normal Expenses of Students

A survey of the cost of attending the University, made in 1937-38, shows that students spend an average of \$43 each month. This figure does not include clothes or enrolment fees.

## Opportunities for Self Support

The University discourages the registration of students who are entirely without financial resources, but it does encourage and assist students who must work to remain in school. All student employment is in charge of J. F. Findlay, Dean of Men.

The new student should have money to take care of his expenses for at least several months, since most of the available jobs are held by upperclassmen.

Fifty-five per cent of the students attending the University work to pay all or part of their expenses.
