1925

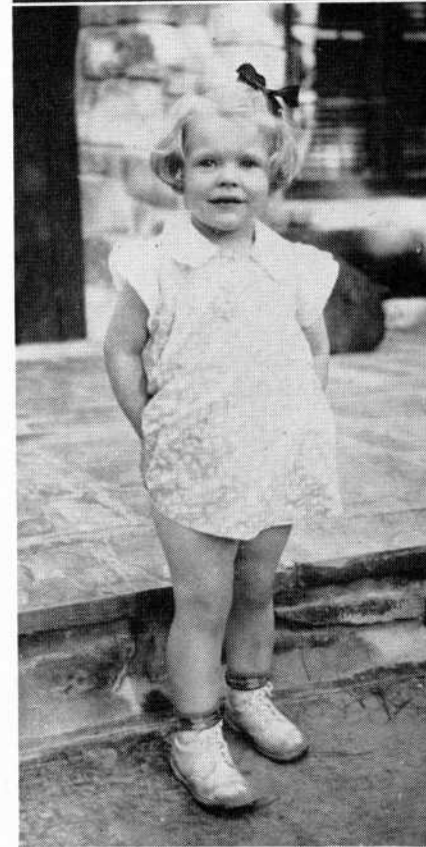
