

First Shipment Sold Out . . . Others on the Way

The first shipment of University of Oklahoma Commemorative Plates made by the Wedgwood Company, of England, has arrived in Oklahoma. Advance orders were sufficient to exhaust the entire first shipment.

However, another shipment of 168 plates is due to arrive in Oklahoma soon, according to best information available from the importers. Shipments are on an irregular schedule, due to war conditions, but so far there has been so serious disruption of shipping between England and New York. The second shipment of O.U. plates will be exactly like the first shipment—all are "First Edition" plates with a special back stamp that will not appear on later editions. The plates are 10½ inches in diameter, framed by Wedgwood's time-honored "Patrician" border, with an original drawing of the University Administration Building in the center of Staffordshire red. One of the plates may be examined at the Mart on the ground floor of the Union Building on the University campus.
