Will Rogers, who received a degree from the University of Oklahoma in 1930, has served as Oklahoma's congressman-at-large since 1933. In the various elections in which he has participated, he has received a majority in every county in the State six times.

At the beginning of his second term as congressman-at-large, Rogers was elected chairman of the House Committee on Indian Affairs, a position of unusual importance to Oklahoma because of the 130,000 Indians in this State.

Oklahoma Territory (now Oklahoma), and grew up on a farm. He attended Southwestern College at Weatherford, Central College at Edmond, and received his master's degree from the University of Oklahoma. He is a school man by profession.

In the present national and world crisis, with Congress facing decisions of vital importance to the future of America, the nation needs the steady hands of experienced men to guide the ship of state. Will Rogers is well equipped by education and by years of experience in Congress and by his wide contacts with all classes of people in Oklahoma to represent his native State capably in Congress during the next two years.
