## Medical School

DR. H. A. SHOEMAKER, acting dean of the School of Medicine, last month attended an orientation course for civilian representatives of colleges participating in the Navy Training Program held at the Naval Reserve Midshipmen's School, Columbia University, New York City.

Purpose of the course was to make available a wider understanding of the Navy, its operation and its mission.

Dr. Shoemaker and Seward R. Sheldon, '15ba, of the *Cleveland Press* in Ohio, will represent the University of Oklahoma at the centennial anniversary of the Western Reserve School of Medicine, Cleveland, on October 27.

Dr. Donald D. McMullen, associate professor of hygiene and public health, has been selected by the Committee of the Teaching of Tropical Medicine of the Association of American Medical Colleges to spend six weeks in practical field work in Central America.

Dr. McMullen will spend about three weeks at a United Fruit Company hospital, followed by a week with the local field unit of the Office of the Co-ordinator of Inter-American Affairs.

Lt. Victor H. Kelley, of the Naval Reserve, has been appointed assistant to the commanding officer of the Navy Training Unit at the School of Medicine. In civilian life, Lieutenant Kelley served as director of appointments at the University of Arizona, Tucson.

Dr. Allen J. Stanley, who is on a year's leave of absence from Louisiana State University, has been appointed assistant professor of physiology at the School of Medicine.

Dr. Stanley will come to Oklahoma from St. John's College, Annapolis, Maryland, where he went by invitation to assist in establishing their curriculum in biology. He has had numerous papers published on the physiology of endocrines, some of them appearing in the Journal of Morphology, Anatomical Record, Proceedings of the Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine, and Proceedings of the Louisiana Academy of Science.

University Hospital has been approved to train nurses in the United States Public Health Service Cadet Nurse Corps program and was awaiting it first class of 48 students.

Funds for the University program are contained in allotments totaling \$3,749,630 to carry on the program in 58 accredited nursing schools over the nation. University Hospital expects a second class of

corps students in February, according to Kathlyn Krammes, director of the School of Nursing.

Funds for the Cadet Nurse Corps, termed the "biggest advancement for nursing" in years, are provided by a Congressional act to increase the number of nurses for military and civilian needs.
