COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES for approximately 80 University of Oklahoma medical students and nurses were held September 15 in the Oklahoma City University auditorium.

Speaker for the occasion was Dr. Chauncey D. Leake, dean and executive vice president of the University of Texas Medical Branch and principal administrator of hospitals at Galveston.
