Lt. John Shirk, the University's Big Six discus champion of 1938 and all-Big Six end of the Sooner football powerhouse of 1939, was liberated from a German prison camp at Luckenwald, 30 miles south of Berlin. Edward Beattie, Jr., United Press war correspondent, wired the good news to Shirk's mother, Mrs. John Shirk of Oklahoma City. Mrs. Shirk received the message May 13, Mother's Day. Shirk was captured at Salerno.

SOONER TRACK TEAM STOPS THREAT-ENED AGGIE SPORTS SWEEP . . . Winning all the track events save the 100 and 220 yard dashes, Coach John Jacobs' Sooner track team decisively defeated the Oklahoma Aggies at Owen Field May 11 in the 32nd annual dual meet, 80 to 46. The Sooner triumph prevented what would have been the first Oklahoma Aggie sweep of the school year's entire sports program in 50 years. The Aggie football team had won 28-6, and the national championship Aggie basketball team had also defeated the Sooners twice.

Joe Richardson of Oklahoma won the 440, Homer Sparkman of Oklahoma the 880, Clarence Vicklund of Oklahoma the mile and two-mile, Fred Hawley of Oklahoma the high and low hurdles. Bob Fenimore, the Aggie All-America football player from Woodward, took the 100 and 220 yard dashes in 9.8 and 21.5 seconds and also won the broad jump at 22 feet 8 inches for individual honors.

Bob Kurland, Aggie seven-foot All-America basketball center, won the shot put and was one of three Aggies tying for first in the high jump. Sooner Millard Cummings won the discus and Sooner Bill Wilson tied for first in the pole vault.
