Indian Artist Honored

Woodrow Crumbo, '36-'38, Tulsa, one of the nation's leading Indian artists, has been awarded a fellowship by the Julius Rosenwald Foundation for the coming year. This is the first time such a fellowship, carrying a grant of \$2,400, renewable for two years if the artist's work warrants it, has been awarded to an Indian.

Now employed as a foundry foreman at the Douglas Aircraft plant in Tulsa, Mr. Crumbo has held scholarships at the American Indian Institute in Wichita, Kansas, and Wichita University. In 1938 he became head of the art department at Bacone College, Muskogee, leaving there to enter the aviation industry in 1941.

Of the 19 pictures Mr. Crumbo sent to the Rosenwald jury in applying for the fellowship, 14 were painted last year in his off-work hours. Mr. Crumbo's work has been exhibited in the San Francisco Museum and in galleries at Yale University, Washington, D.C., Chicago and New York City.
