## Blind Vet Earns Chem Degree

War causes undue hardships, but some of these can be compensated for by determination and hard work. That's what Leonard Dodson, '46bs, former Army lieutenant in the Field Artillery, discovered when he returned, almost totally blind, to the University of Oklahoma last January, needing only two more semesters to receive a bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering.

After he participated in almost nine months of continuous combat service, a mortar shell exploded in his face as he was attempting to rescue a wounded buddy near Luneville, France.

He presented a difficult problem to Army surgeons, since some believed his sight could be saved by removing the fragments imbedded in the pupils of his eyes, while others thought too much risk was involved in an operation. Dodson gambled on surgery—and lost. He is now totally blind in his right eye, and vaguely can see objects at distances at less than one foot with the other.

Becoming acclimated to studying under such conditions was hard at first, but soon he became adapted to his physical condition. He took his tests and examinations at the blackboard, diagraming the complicated chemistry problems with clear, legible drawings. His attractive wife, Martha, who is a graduate of the University, read the home assignments to him and helped in reviewing new information. She is an instructor in the speech department so aiding her husband with his studies falls in direct line with her teaching chores.

Professors in the college of engineering have honest respect for the work Dodson has accomplished. One instructor who taught him before he entered the Army says his progress in his studies is better now than it was when he went away because of his diligent application. The professors give him a hand now and then, but most of the time he worked all of his problems on his own initiative. He has maintained a "B" average since his return.

For his work at home Dodson has a talking book machine which plays records of his text books. He also uses a crude-looking braille, circular slide rule in working problems.

Dodson received his BS degree, July 30, but he is going to work for a masters degree in education, specializing in vocational guidance work.

Besides his work in education, Dodson also plans to go into business for himself to produce new cement. His specialty is the development of soil cement, which can be made into bricks, logs and monolithic walls for buildings. After the unlimited amount of fortitude he has displayed this year in his University work, there is little doubt in the minds of his professors, or the people of Kaw City, his home town, that Dodson's success will also be unlimited in his chosen field.

## With the Armed Forces

Maj. N. Robert Drummond, class of 1936 has just been assigned to the 308th Bomb Wing (L), APO 712 located at Kimpo Army Air Base, 18 miles from Seoul, the Korean capital. His present duty is that of wing surgeon in charge of all medical activities of his unit.

Major Drummond was commissioned as an officer in June 1936 and went on active duty in July 1940.

As well as being assigned overseas service in Korea he has also served in the Medical Air Transport Service, Naples, Italy.

► Maj. Robert W. Butler, '38, has been awarded the Army Commendation Ribbon by Gen. Mark Clark at a joint awards-promotion ceremony in Vienna, Austria.

After leaving the University, Major Butler was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Officers' Reserve Corps.
