Riding the Sooner Range

This month-commencement month of June, 1948—we take you in a gallop over the trails of the Sooner Range via special broadcast over WNAD on Sunday afternoon, May 30, when representatives of the Reunion Classes of 1948 from all sections of the country were assembled in the Oklahoma Memorial Union Building. Here is what the radio announcer said in introducing dozens of these prominent Sooner alumni:

"Forty-four years ago this afternoon, a young graduate of the University was elected President of the O. U. Alumni Association; that man is DR. ROY P. STOOPS, '98ba, a practicing physician of OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA. Dr. Stoops is here today enjoying the reunion of the class of '98 and participating in many commencement activities. This is his first visitation to the campus in many,

MILTON M. MAYNARD. '08ba, who is con-nected with Monmouth College in MONMOUTH, ILLINOIS, has arrived and is participating in the activities. ERRETT R. NEWBY, '07bm, '08ba, prominent OKLAHOMA CITY official and state leader, is here with his class of '08. ED HARRIS, '08ba, of NORMAN, is here much in evidence with all of the Harris "in family," life members of the O. U. Alumni Association.
