1932: Truth & Consequences

In 1932, the *Daily* and the *Daily Oklahoman* printed what they considered to be the truth and their reporter paid the consequences.

"Fourteen members of the outlawed secret society known as D. D. M. C. severely beat Bill Stephens of Oklahoma City, *Daily* reporter and student reporter for the *Daily Oklahoman* and *Oklahoma City Times*, early in the morning of Wednesday, December 7. Before beating him they stated they objected to the kind of stories he sent his newspapers. Then they left him to walk home.

"After a week of intensive investigation they were expelled by the University. Governor Murray (Alfalfa Bill) having received assurance of the members that they would disband permanently, issued an executive order re-admitting them to the University.

"The December issue of the *Whirlwind*, campus humor magazine, was released December 16, with pictures of Wilma Klien, Oklahoma City and Paul Lyon, Geary, winners of the "best dressed ed and co-ed" contest.

"The title "Best Drilled Soldier" in the freshman class has been won by Bob C. Downing, Tulsa. Second and third places were given to Charles E. Miller, Mangum, and Oscar D. Johnson, Okemah."
