Big "Red" in 1932

THE football season of 1932 had only one thing to recommend it: the team had two new coaches, Lewie Hardage and John "Bo" Rowland. But with a depression, overdue stadium payments, and 1931's next-to-bottom rating in the Big Six, the Sooners were understandably unenthusiastic about the energy of two new coaches.

The picture fished out of the Roy E. Heffner collection for last month's Roll Call page shows these two coaches trying to instill a little of their energy into a weary back named Evans "Red" Chambers (No. 8). The player to Chambers' left is Bob Dunlap, the triple-threat quarterback who led the 1932 Big Red to second place in the conference.

Chambers is now a 45-year-old practicing surgeon in Enid, and is married to the former Virginia Hudson, '36ba. They met while Chambers was attending O.U.'s medical school. The Chambers have two children, Dana Starr, 8, and Evans, 15. The 15-year-old Evans (who is not called Junior) plays on his high school's sophomore team.

Chambers' father, Dr. Claude Chambers of Seminole, was formerly a member of the Board of Regents and is presently a member of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. Quite a few alumni remember and wrote in about Doctor Chambers. Can you identify the bored fellow on Page 17?
