To make this possible, with the least effort, we have assembled a printed directory showing a person's name and address, their interests and other notes about them. We endeavor to tell when they own an organ or have one available and what type or types of music each prefers to play or listen to. A standard tape speed of 7½ inches per second, dual track, has been accepted to maintain fidelity and achieve some form of standardization. Any deviation from this standard will be noted in the individual's listing. We also list personal preferences ise. church or theatre pipe organ, elec-tric or electronic organ, and facts such as whether stereo record or playback equipment is available. Prospective new members should furnish us with all of the above information.

We are devoted to the furtherance of organ music, be it from the pipe organ or electronic organ. This club's primary interest is the exchange of organ music and the discussion of organ playing, building and other associated subjects. We do not intend to offer competition to any of the other established tape clubs since it is through their publications that we have been able to progress as

far as we have today.
